This is to certify that Mrs Sophie Gomez-Afolabi named above worked with us as nurse coordinator in the Childhood TB program from November 2011 to August 2015. The Childhood TB program, code named 'Reach for Kids', is a research platform for childhood TB encompassing clinical, epidemiological and immunological studies aimed at improving diagnosis and management of TB in children. As nurse coordinator, Sophie was responsible for organisation of field and clinic activities including contact tracing, clinical evaluation and isoniazid prophylaxis among child contacts of adults with recently diagnosed infectious TB. Her work also involved record keeping, data recording and supervision of field workers and nurses.

Sophie is organised and shows seriousness at work. She is good with nursing skills and competent in the role assigned to her. Sophie is able to multi-task, an attribute that was crucial in ensuring efficiency and productivity in the team. She stood up to the challenge of successfully organising the day to day activities of the Reach for Kids program which was the first paediatric TB research platform ever established at the MRC.
